### **Weekend Closure of Bristol Road-Upper State Road Intersection Postponed**

The planned closure this weekend (Oct. 29-30) of the intersection of Bristol Road and Upper State Road in New Britain, Doylestown and Warrington townships, Bucks County, has been postponed due to expected rainy weather, the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation announced today.

The closure and detour for pavement reconstruction and resurfacing at the intersection has been rescheduled to be in place from 5 a.m. Saturday (Nov. 5) to 6 p.m. Sunday (Nov. 6).

During the two-day operation, Bristol Road will be closed to through traffic between Lower State Road and Route 202 (Butler Avenue). Upper State Road will be closed to through traffic between Almshouse Road/Tamenend Avenue and Route 152 (Limekiln Pike). Both roads will remain open to local traffic up to the intersection.

Detour signs will be posted to guide motorists around the closed intersection. The posted detour will use Route 152 (Limekiln Pike), County Line Road, Lower State Road, Almshouse Road/Tamenend Avenue and Route 202 (Butler Avenue).

The planned weekend operation is dependent on dry weather.

PennDOT is repairing and resurfacing the intersection as part of its \$42.2 million project to build the northern section of the Route 202 Parkway between Pickertown Road in Warrington Township and Route 611 in Doylestown Township. James D. Morrissey, Inc. of Philadelphia is the general contractor.
