Bristol Road-Upper State Road Intersection in Bucks County Closed This Weekend for Resurfacing

King of Prussia – The intersection of Bristol Road and Upper State Road in New Britain, Doylestown and Warrington townships, Bucks County will be closed and detoured from 5 a.m. Saturday (Oct. 29) to 6 p.m. Sunday (Oct. 30) for pavement reconstruction and resurfacing, the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation announced today.

During the two-day operation, Bristol Road will be closed to through traffic between Lower State Road and Route 202 (Butler Avenue). Upper State Road will be closed to through traffic between Almshouse Road/Tamenend Avenue and Route 152 (Limekiln Pike). Both roads will remain open to local traffic up to the intersection.

Detour signs will be posted to guide motorists around the closed intersection. The posted detour will use Route 152 (Limekiln Pike), County Line Road, Lower State Road, Almshouse Road/Tamenend Avenue and Route 202 (Butler Avenue).

This weekend operation is dependent on dry weather.

PennDOT is repairing and resurfacing the intersection as part of its \$42.2 million project to build the northern section of the Route 202 Parkway between Pickertown Road in Warrington Township and Route 611 in Doylestown Township. James D. Morrissey, Inc. of Philadelphia is the general contractor.
