Lane Closures Scheduled for US 202 Parkway Construction in Bucks and Montgomery Counties

King of Prussia – Motorists will face daytime single-lane conditions in Warrington Township, Bucks County next week (Nov. 15-19) along with continuing traffic restrictions in Upper Gwynedd, Lower Gwynedd and Montgomery townships, Montgomery County for Route 202 Parkway construction, the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation said today.

Flaggers will direct an alternating single lane of traffic Monday through Friday (Nov. 15-19) from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. at the following Bucks County locations for construction of the middle section of the Route 202 Parkway:

- Route 152 (Limekiln Pike) between Stump Road and Naomi Lane (just west of Upper State Road) in Warrington Township, for widening;
- Stump Road between Route 152 (Limekiln Pike) and County Line Road in Warrington Township for water main installation; and
- Upper State Road between County Line and Pickertown Road in Warrington Township for widening.

Construction in Montgomery County will restrict travel lanes at the following locations Monday through Friday (Nov. 15-19) from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. for construction of the southern connection to the Route 202 Parkway:

- Route 202 (DeKalb Pike) between Sumneytown Pike and Knapp Road in Montgomery, Upper Gwynedd and Lower Gwynedd townships for widening and utility relocations; and
- Route 63 (Welsh Road) between Stump Road and Route 202 (DeKalb Pike) Lower Gwynedd and Montgomery townships for widening.

Drivers should expect delays at each of the work areas. Motorists are advised to add extra time for travel through all work areas.

Bristol Road in Warrington Township also remains closed to through traffic between Upper State and Stump roads for continuing construction to widen the road approaching the Parkway.
