## **Possible Daytime Lane Closures Along Route 202 Corridor in Montgomery and Bucks Counties**

**King of Prussia** – Motorists traveling on Route 202 (DeKalb Pike) and several other roads along the Route 202 corridor in Montgomery and Bucks counties will encounter flaggers and single-lane conditions next week for ongoing construction of the Route 202 Parkway, the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation said today.

Route 202 (DeKalb Pike) may be reduced to a single lane between Sumneytown Pike and Route 63 (Welsh Road) in Upper Gwynedd, Lower Gwynedd and Montgomery townships on Monday through Friday (Jan. 17-21). Flaggers may be in place to direct an alternating single lane of northbound or southbound traffic through the work area each day from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. as crews continue utility construction and widening.

Flaggers also may be in place Monday through Friday (Jan. 17-21) from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Route 63 (Welsh Road) from Bell Run Boulevard, located east of North Wales Road, to Stump Road. Construction is underway there to build the future connection with the Parkway.

Daytime flaggers also may be in place on County Line Road at the intersection with Route 202 (Butler Avenue) in New Britain and Montgomery townships. Periodic lane restrictions could occur Monday through Friday (Jan. 17-21) from 9 a.m. until 3 p.m. for ongoing gas line installation. This work is part of the \$13.5 million project to widen County Line Road between Route 202 and Stump Road at the approaches to the Parkway.

Flaggers also may be in place to direct a single lane of traffic Monday through Friday (Jan. 17-21) from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Route 152 (Limekiln Pike) between Stump Road and Route 202 (Butler Pike), and on Upper State Road between County Line Road and Pickertown Road. Construction at both these Warrington Township locations is underway to widen roads as they approach the Parkway.

Wells Road in Doylestown Township remains detoured for Parkway construction between Lower State and Turk roads, and Detweiler Road is closed permanently between Stump and Upper State roads in Warrington Township.

Drivers should anticipate delays at each of the work zones and are advised to add extra time for travel through these areas. The work schedule is dependent on the weather.

All activities are associated with PennDOT's \$200 million project to build the nine-mile long Route 202 Parkway in Bucks and Montgomery counties and to widen and improve roads approaching the Parkway.
