Single-Lane Closure with Flaggers Wednesday For Utility Work on Route 202 at Hancock Road in Montgomery County

Continuing Travel Restrictions at Other Locations Next Week for Route 202 Parkway Construction in Bucks and Montgomery Counties

King of Prussia – Route 202 (DeKalb Pike) motorists will encounter lane closures at the intersection with Hancock Road in Upper Gwynedd and Lower Gwynedd townships, Montgomery County on Wednesday (April 6) for utility work related to the construction of the Route 202 Parkway, the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation said today.

Flaggers will direct a single lane of traffic through the work area on Wednesday (April 6) from 9 a.m. until 3 p.m. Traffic backups during this operation may impact travel on Route 202 (DeKalb Pike) between Sumneytown Pike and Route 63 (Welsh Road).

In addition, drivers may find periodic daytime lane closures Monday through Friday (April 4-8) at a number of locations along the Route 202 Corridor for ongoing construction of the Route 202 Parkway.

Utility relocation and road widening work at the southern connection to the Parkway in Upper Gwynedd, Lower Gwynedd and Montgomery townships may require daytime lane restrictions Monday through Friday (April 4-8) from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. at other locations on Route 202 (DeKalb Pike) between Sumneytown Pike and Route 309 (Bethlehem Pike) and on Route 63 (Welsh Road) between Stump Road and Bell Run Boulevard, located east of North Wales Road.

In Bucks County, Parkway construction will impact motorists at several locations in Warrington, New Britain and Doylestown townships.

Almshouse Road remains closed and detoured between Upper State Road and Lower State Road as crews reconstruct and lower a 500-foot long section of Almshouse Road in the area where the Route 202 Parkway will cross over the road.

Flagger-controlled single-lane conditions will be in place Monday through Friday (April 4-8) from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. for road widening on Route 152 (Limekiln Pike) between Stump Road and Route 202 (Butler Avenue), and on Upper State Road between County Line and Pickertown roads.

Drivers also may face periodic brief stoppages for equipment crossings on County Line Road between Upper State and Stump Road on Monday through Friday (April 4-8) from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Wells Road remains detoured for Parkway construction between Lower State and



Turk roads, and Detweiler Road is closed permanently between Stump and Upper State roads in Warrington Township.

Drivers should anticipate delays at each of the work zones and are advised to add extra time for travel through these areas. All planned activities are contingent on the weather.

PennDOT is investing more than \$200 million in state funds to build the nine-mile long Route 202 Parkway in Bucks and Montgomery counties and to improve roads approaching the Parkway's entrances.
