Travel Restrictions Scheduled on Route 202 and Route 63 in Montgomery County and Route 152 and Stump Road in Bucks County

King of Prussia – Motorists in Montgomery and Bucks counties will encounter single lane conditions on several state roads next week (Nov. 8-12) for continuing construction to build the Route 202 Parkway and to widen Route 202 between Hancock Road and Route 63, the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation said today.

Flaggers will direct an alternating single lane of northbound or southbound traffic on Route 202 (DeKalb Pike) in Upper and Lower Gwynedd townships for road construction at its connection to the Parkway. The restrictions will be in place between Sunneystown Pike and Route 63 (Welsh Road) on Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Motorists also may encounter intermittent traffic stoppages for equipment movements on Route 63 (Welsh Road) between Stump Road and Route 202 (DeKalb Pike) in Lower Gwynedd and Montgomery townships Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. until 3 p.m.

In addition, drivers in Warrington Township, Bucks County, will encounter daytime single lane conditions on Route 152 (Limekiln Pike) and Stump Road for Parkway construction.

Flagger-controlled alternating lane closures will be in effect on Route 152 (Limekiln Pike) between Naomi Lane (just west of Upper State Road) and Stump Road Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. for drainage pipe installation.

A single-lane pattern with flaggers also will be in place Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. until 3 p.m. on Stump Road between Route 152 (Limekiln Pike) and County Line Road for water main installation.

Bristol Road in Warrington Township also remains closed to through traffic between Upper State and Stump roads for continuing construction to widen the road approaching its connection with the Parkway.

Motorists are advised to add extra time for travel through all work areas. All planned activities are weather permitting.

The roadwork on Route 152 (Limekiln Pike), Stump Road and Bristol Road is part of the \$200 million project to construct the nine-mile long Route 202 Parkway. The Parkway is scheduled to open in mid-2012.
