Travel Restrictions Scheduled on Route 202, Route 63 in Upper Gwynedd and Lower Gwynedd Townships, Montgomery County

King of Prussia – Northbound and southbound Route 202 (DeKalb Pike) in Upper and Lower Gwynedd townships, Montgomery County, will be restricted to one lane of traffic between Sumneytown Pike and Route 63 (Welsh Road) on Tuesday through Friday (Sept. 7-10) from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. for roadway construction, the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation said today.

Eastbound and westbound Route 63 (Welsh Road) in Lower Gwynedd Township also will be limited to a single lane between Stump Road and Route 202 (DeKalb Pike) on Tuesday through Friday (Sept. 7-10) from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. for utility construction.

Motorists can expect to face travel delays on both roadways as flaggers direct an alternating single lane of traffic through the two work zones. Motorists are advised to add extra time for travel through the work area, or to avoid the area if possible during construction.

This work is part of the \$17.7 million project to widen and improve two miles of Route 202 (DeKalb Pike) from Swedesford Road to Route 309, and to connect Route 202 (DeKalb Pike) with the new Route 202 Parkway, which also is under construction.

All planned operations are weather permitting.
